Additionally, I noticed a capitalization issue with the word "Distributed," which should be in lowercase as "distributed" unless it is a proper noun or part of a title.</p> <p><b>Suggestions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Include specific numerical results or major conclusions to enhance clarity and impact.</li><li>2. Revise the capitalization of "Distributed" to "distributed" for consistency and accuracy.</li></ol>	<p>This has been effected</p>
<p><b>Is the manuscript scientifically, correct? Please write here.</b></p>	<p>The manuscript is scientifically robust, with a sound methodology and clear presentation of results. However, there are areas that require improvement for better clarity and conciseness.</p> <p><b>Issues and Suggestions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>Issue:</b> The introduction repeats information about maternal education multiple times, which disrupts the flow of the narrative. (Introduction Page 2) <b>Suggestion:</b> Merge repetitive content about maternal education.</li><li>2. <b>Issue:</b> The sampling method described as "random sampling" could confuse readers since balloting is mentioned. (Methodology Page 3)  <b>Suggestion:</b> Clarify whether this is a simple random or stratified random sampling technique.</li><li>3. <b>Issue:</b> Results are comprehensive but lack depth in statistical interpretation (e.g., Chisquare test results). (Results Page 5)  <b>Suggestion:</b> Expand on statistically significant findings and include confidence intervals where applicable.</li><li>4. <b>Issue:</b> The conclusion is aligned with the study's objectives but reiterates points already discussed in the results.
