Editor's Comment:

This is a very important topic for the cardiologist as well as for the cardiac surgeon. Pathologies of the ascending aorta, such as aneurysms and dissections, present a challenge in cardiovascular surgery. The Bentall procedure, which replaces the aorta and aortic valve while reimplanting the coronary arteries, reduces mortality and morbidity. However, the use of biological prostheses can lead to complications, such as late aortic dissections. Patients who have undergone Bentall's procedure must be monitored long-term for complications such as aortic dissections. Judious clinical follow-up and advanced imaging techniques are essential to improve prognosis and manage risks.

With due consideration to the reviewer's comments and the revision done, the decision on the manuscript for the Asian Journal of Cardiology Research is Accepted.

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
