Adult-onset Still's disease is a rare form of arthritis with very few worldwide cases each year. Patients suffering from this condition do not generally find a permanent cure. Therefore, any treatment with a favorable outcome must be reported in the literature so that physicians and other healthcare professionals can practice evidence-based medicine. This case report is an example of the same. The authors have concluded that Early recognition of atypical signs and symptoms can improve the prognosis of patients with this complex systemic disease. The study is important for the health community.
