	Areas for Improvement: Grammar and Syntax: Some sentences are grammatically incorrect or awkwardly constructed, which can hinder readability. For instance:	
	"Smartphones are technical devices that have a huge impact on people's daily lives, causing them to change their habits and behaviors." This sentence could be rewritten as: "Smartphones profoundly influence daily life, shaping habits and behavioral patterns."	
	Redundancy: Certain ideas are repeated unnecessarily, especially in the abstract and introduction. For example: "Smartphones are technical devices that have a huge impact on people's daily lives, causing them to change their habits and behaviors" is reiterated multiple times.	
	Scholarly Tone: The language occasionally lacks the formal tone expected in scholarly writing. For instance: Phrases like "causing them to change their habits" and "students are moderately addicted to smartphones" could be rephrased to sound more professional.	
	Transitions: Some paragraphs lack smooth transitions, making the narrative feel fragmented. Adding connecting phrases would improve flow.	
	Use of Active Voice: Passive constructions dominate the text. For instance: "The study employed a descriptive-correlation type of research." This could be rewritten as: "This study used a descriptive-correlational research design."
