These adjustments would make the abstract more precise and impactful.	
Is the manuscript scientifically, correct? Please write here.	The manuscript is scientifically correct but would benefit from more detailed data analysis, precise language, and acknowledgment of limitations to improve its robustness and appeal to the scientific community.

The references provided are relevant but focus mainly on Indian studies, lacking comparative perspectives from Pakistan or neighboring countries. Many sources are dated, with limited recent studies from the past 3–5 years. Including newer, region-specific research from Sindh or Pakistan would enhance the manuscript's contextual and scientific rigor. To enhance the manuscript, consider including the following: 1.
